We are a working Yacht Club! We are able to keep the cost of membership and our dock fees low, while providing quality facilities, events and activities for our membership, families and friends. We are able to do this by requiring each member provide a minimum number of work hours. Docking members are required to work 20 hours and reserve & social members 10 hours. REMEMBER...this is a minimum requirement. (continued...)

If you spend any time at the club you will notice that it is usually the same people that provide the majority of the work hours. Usually by choice, but by necessity as well. Our membership is as low as it has ever been, but the workload is not. We understand everyone has a busy schedule and any extra help is greatly appreciated. Please be sure to document your time on a "work hours" slip and notify P/C Greg Sattler that your work hours have been completed so he doesn't bill you for uncompleted work. In addition, the lease requires that we contribute "X" number of dollars in capital improvements to the facility on a yearly basis. We need to verify the capital improvements with written record (work hours). The work slips are found in the clubhouse usually by the window to the left of the door as you enter. Fill out the slip with an accurate account of the work you completed, keeping the white copy for your self and drop the yellow copy in the mailbox posted in that same area. It is helpful if you are able to get the signature of a trustee, chairperson in charge of a job, or someone on the bridge. I keep the records for the members and the State of Ohio. Thank you for this consideration.
